



## Transcript for “Where are we?” Video August 2008

**Narrator:** Wow, this place is huge! How am I going to find anything around here?

*(Enters office in B4 Coates Hall)*

**Narrator:** Wow, I am completely lost. What is this place?

**Student Worker 1:** This is Career Services, in the basement of Coates Hall.

**Narrator:** Oh, I’ve heard of you guys. I don’t really know what you’re about, though. What do you do here?

**Student Worker 1:** Well, what we do, we help students at every stage of getting a career. So, we usually start with Career Decision Making, which is helping them find majors, helping them with career assessments, and that sort of thing. Then we usually move on to Experiential Education, which is helping them get internships and co-ops and fellowships and part-time jobs and just basic experience in their field. And then we go to the Job Search department, which has résumé reviews

*(Phone rings)*

**Student Worker 1:** Excuse me.

*(Answers phone)*

**Student Worker 1:** Career Services. Can you hold, please? (Pause) Thank you.

*(Turns back to camera)*

**Student Worker 1:** Sorry about that. So, with Job Search, we help them with the resumes and with actually finding the job within their field. Helping them find specific jobs that they would like to do. We also help with the grad school application and so on. And, finally, we actually work with employers and the students to try to connect them together with interviews and that sort of thing.

**Narrator:** Wow. I don’t know where to start. I don’t even know what I want to major in yet.

**Student Worker 1:** Well, maybe what we can do is look in the CIC over here, our library, where we have all kinds of resources for you.

*(Walks to Career Information Center. Gestures to wall of handouts.)*

**Student Worker 1:** What we have here is these are pamphlets that actually tell you what you can do with each degree, so if you major in English, it’ll tell you what you can do

with an English degree, or Engineering, or whatever you want to do. So, that’s a really great resource, and then also we have a whole library over here with job search books and career decision making and experiential education. So, basically whatever you need, you can check out and take home and look at.

*(Cut to 1502 Patrick F. Taylor Hall location. Cameraperson enters suite.)*

**Student Worker 2:** Hi, my name is Katy. I’m a student worker in the Patrick F. Taylor office, the second part of Career Services. In our office, we mainly do the On-Campus Interviewing Program. You can participate, either with that and job listings through our new Careers2Geaux service. And with the On-Campus Interviewing Program, you can actually participate, be, have an interview for a full-time job.

*(Gestures to dress for success display.)*

If you don’t know what to wear for your job, we have examples. You know, suit and tie, skirt, jacket. Not jeans and a T-shirt or shorts, like I’m wearing. Those are bad.

*(Gestures to interview room.)*

And then, an example of one of the interviewing offices is right in here.

*(Interview room is shown.)*
