# STAR Employer Program and Tiger Network

**How can you help?**

## **Tiger Network**

LSU Career Services offers a range of recruiting opportunities at LSU, but there are other opportunities to support our office and LSU students/alumni that may interest you. **Tiger Network**, our mentoring program, facilitates networking through a system that is free for you and the student/alumni participants. Our **STAR Employer Program** helps us enhance our services using financial contributions from employers that we recognize throughout the year as “STARS.”

Tiger Network, LSU Career Services’ virtual mentoring system, allows students to connect with professionals for advice about occupations, regions, employment and graduate or professional school.

As a mentor, you will determine your level of involvement, which may range from responding to occasional e-mails to allowing a student to “shadow you for a day.”

Becoming a Tiger Network Mentor is as simple as completing a brief profile online, indicating the nature of the information you are willing to provide (e.g., geographic, industry), letting us know how you want to be involved (e.g., e-mail only, phone, career panels, job shadows), then responding to students who contact you.

Your time is valuable, which is why we allow you to limit the number of times you are contacted. To prevent excessive correspondence and to protect you, we will not share your contact information until a student specifically requests it. Even then, the student will use the contact methods you indicate are appropriate.

We encourage you to create more than one profile, for your current *and* former jobs, so students can contact you about any of the positions you have had in the federal government.

# Interviewing On Campus

## **Scheduling Interviews**

We offer three options for scheduling interviews in the fall and spring semesters: preselect; open; and room-only. Please choose only one option per schedule. Call Courtney Edwards, Assistant Director, at 225-578-2162 to schedule an interview date.

### **Preselect Schedule**

The preselect schedule allows recruiters to review submitted résumés prior to the campus visit and select candidates to be interviewed. Students who are preselected then have the opportunity to sign up first for interview times. If alternates are chosen, they then have the opportunity to sign up for interview times, should slots remain available on the final day of signups.

### **Open Schedules**

The open schedule allows LSU students and alumni who meet the organization's requirements to sign up for interviews on a first-come, first-served basis.

### **Room-only Schedules**

If you choose a room-only schedule format, you will select your interview candidates from an available source, such as résumés collected at Career Expo, résumés drops, job postings, résumés referrals, or contact with student groups. A room-only allows you to contact students directly and schedule interviews yourself after reserving your interview date with our recruiting coordinator. Students and alumni on your schedule must be registered with Career Services. Students from other universities are not allowed to interview at our facility.

## **One-Day Interview Programs**

Special recruitment days are coordinated by Career Services for areas that are not heavily recruited during the regular On-Campus Recruiting Program. If you are not available for the scheduled date, your organization is welcome to participate in the On-Campus Interviewing Program or to receive résumés referrals. Please see "Calendar of Events" for event dates.

- **Art & Design Interviewing Day:** Employers connect with students in the College of Art & Design. (spring only)
- **Teacher Interviewing Day:** School systems interview students interested in the field of education for full-time teaching, counseling and social work positions. (fall and spring)
- **Construction Interviewing Day:** Employers in the field of construction interview students for internships, co-ops and full-time employment. (fall and spring)

# Job Posting and Résumé Referral Services

Careers2Geaux is LSU's online system for job postings and on-campus interviews. Through Careers2Geaux, you may post full-time, part-time, internship, co-op, summer and volunteer opportunities. This system is password-protected and available to LSU students, faculty, staff, and registered alumni 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

## Job Posting Fees

Recent, drastic cuts to LSU's budget necessitate that we charge for postings. Your organization will be assessed on the following fee structure for each posting:

- . \$30 for a full-time posting by a for-profit organization
- . \$20 for a full-time posting by a nonprofit (including government) organization
- . \$20 for a part-time, internship or co-op posting by a for-profit organization
- . \$15 for a part-time, internship or co-op posting by a nonprofit (including government) organization
- . Postings for volunteer positions are free
- . STAR Employers receive three free postings

**Listing Job Vacancies:** To list your position on our Careers2Geaux website, visit <https://www.myinterfase.com/lsu/employer/> and follow the instructions for creating an account. Once you enter the information for your position, the ad will appear online in just a few minutes.

**Part-time Job Vacancies:** If the position you wish to fill requires students in specific disciplines, or could be best performed by students in specific disciplines, you may wish to contact Career Services staff to explore the option of converting your part-time job opportunity into an internship opportunity. A targeted internship opportunity will draw the attention of more skilled applicants, and both you and the candidate would benefit.

**Résumé Referral Service:** Career Services can provide résumé referrals to employers posting full-time job vacancies at no charge. If you choose to use this service, we will search our student database for candidates that meet your specified qualifications and e-mail to you the résumés of potential candidates. Résumés are generally not provided for positions not listed through the Careers2Geaux system.

Please be aware of two factors when utilizing this service:

- Career Services does not notify students that their résumés are being sent to specific employers through the résumé referral service. When you contact students based on résumés received through this service, you will need to inform them how you obtained their résumés.
- Students are encouraged but not required to notify Career Services when they are no longer searching for a job, so your résumé referral set will likely include the résumés of some candidates who have already accepted employment and have not notified Career Services.

To request résumé referrals, after posting your position through Careers2Geaux, e-mail Amy Caillouet [amyc@lsu.edu](mailto:amyc@lsu.edu) with your contact information and the job listing number of the position for which you wish to receive résumés. If there are any filtering criteria you wish used when the referral is processed that are not readily apparent from the job listing online, please include these in your e-mail. If you are a nonprofit or government employer, please submit your request with your job vacancy form. Résumé referrals will be processed within three to five business days after your position is posted online. # LSU Student Achievements

LSU students and alumni excel in their fields on both a nationwide and a worldwide level. Read on to learn about just a few of the outstanding accomplishments our students and alumni have achieved.

- LSU is Louisiana's flagship public research university, located in the state capital, Baton Rouge, 80 miles northwest of New Orleans. It is classified by the Carnegie Foundation as a Doctoral/Research-Extensive university and is one of just a few universities nationwide designated as a land-grant, sea-grant and space grant institution.
- LSU's academic programs include undergraduate, graduate and professional degrees, including 71 bachelors, 72 masters, and 54 doctoral degree programs. The University is composed of 15 colleges and schools: the Colleges of Agriculture, Arts & Sciences, Basic Sciences, Art & Design, Education, Engineering, Honors, and Music & Dramatic Arts; the E. J. Ourso College of Business; the Schools of the Coast & Environment, Social Work and Veterinary Medicine; the Manship School of Mass Communication; and the Graduate School.
- LSU students have achieved an average composite ACT score of 25.3 as of 2006. The newest freshmen class has an average GPA of 3.4; this number continues to rise each year.
- The Flores MBA Program at the E.J. Ourso College is ranked 7<sup>th</sup> in the nation by *The Wall Street Journal*.
- *US News & World Report's 2007 top 100 America's Best Graduate Schools* ranked the following LSU engineering programs: chemical engineering (No. 54), civil engineering (No. 58), environmental engineering (No. 47), mechanical engineering (No. 71), and petroleum engineering (No. 9).
- Honors College students have been named Rhodes, Marshall, Truman and Goldwater Scholars.
- In the past 18 years, 15 internal auditing students from the E.J. Ourso College have earned the highest student score on the Institute of Internal Auditors' Certified Internal Auditor exam.
- The School of the Coast & Environment is recognized as a leading institution worldwide for its involvement in research and other activities relating to the wetlands and the Gulf of Mexico. The school researches a host of areas related to the physical well being and economic viability of Louisiana's wetlands.
- Black Issues in Higher Education's 2005 Top 100 Colleges list ranked LSU 20th among all universities in number of African American students graduating with bachelor's degrees in engineering.
- A team of five students from the Department of Accounting took the top prize for the second consecutive year in the National Act "Extreme Accounting" case study competition, sponsored by "Big Four" firm PricewaterhouseCoopers.
- *Design Intelligence*, the leading journal of the design professions, rated the LSU landscape architecture program as #1 in the nation among undergraduate programs and as #5 in the nation among graduate level programs.
